The musical alphabet is the letters we use for naming pitches. The alphabet consists of seven letters: $A, B, C, D, E, F, G$. After " $G$ " the alphabet repeats.

2. Now write it backwards three times in a row ( $G, F, E, D, C, B, A$ ):


Each letter occupies a specific line or space on the treble clef.


The lines use the letters E-G-B-D-F
