
## the music alphabet & the treble clef

The musical alphabet is the letters we use for naming pitches. The alphabet consists of seven letters: A, B, C, D, E, F, G. After "G" the alphabet repeats.


. Memorize by saying i I. On the line below, write out the musical alphabet three times in a row: over and over again. **ABCDEFGABCDEFGABC GFEDCBAGFEDCBAGFE** 2. Now write it backwards three times in a row (G, F, E, D, C, B, A):

Each letter occupies a specific line or space on the treble clef.


The spaces spell out "FACE." Remember to start from the bottom.



The lines use the letters E-G-B-D-F



3. Your turn! Draw a treble clef and place FACE on the staff



4. Your turn! Draw a treble clef and place EGBDF on the staff

To help remember the letters that go on the lines, let's use a mnemonic device.
